Website News: Focus on Report A Repair Menu

In the last issued we focused on the Money Matters Menu. This time we are focusing on the important Report A Repair Menu.

One of the main benefits of this page is that it enables you to report a repair, direct to Technical Services, at a time convenient to yourself and outwith office hours. However, this service of reporting a repair on-line cannot be used for reporting emergency repairs.

On the home page click on Report A Repair Sub Menu. This takes you to the Report A Repair page.

Type in your details, including your e mail address. In the problem box, briefly describe the problem, you are experiencing. For example, if you are having a problem with a living room door jamming or a toilet not flushing.

Therefore, the benefits are:

- You can report the problem 24 hours a day, outwith office hours.
- You will receive an acknowledgement e mail from ourselves. This is proof of the date and time you advised us of the problem.



On-line Reporting Form

- The note of the problem will go to direct to Technical Services.
- Technical Services will have a typed record of the problem.
- It is a quick and easy process.

Forth's Future Thinking

Never an organisation to sit back and stagnate our Committee and staff members recently spent a Saturday focusing on our future.

The main purpose of the day was to allow everyone to share their thoughts and ideas about how we can embrace the challenges of the year ahead.

The coming year will see the introduction of the Scottish Social Housing Charter, which will make service to tenants the focus of all landlords' activities. We have for several years sought to prioritise the delivery of good services and have involved tenants in monitoring and measuring how well we're doing. However part of the day was spent looking at how we can improve what we do even further.

Similarly responding to the changing funding regime for new homes is always something we've done but maintaining a new build programme in the current economic climate will be a challenge. However having considered that challenge we've concluded we're up for the fight and have some ideas that may become reality.



Factoring Forth In

We have provided property factoring services to owners in our own mixed tenure developments for many years. However, we have recently made our first move into "the big world of factoring".

A group of owners in Victoria Place, Stirling, became disillusioned with the service they were getting from their Glasgow based Factor. They wanted to look for a local alternative and they approached us having heard about and seen the services that we could provide. Therefore, we were elected to become their Factor from 1st December.

This development should make good sense for all of us because the owners will benefit from our local, responsive service and experience. Our tenants will see no reduction in their service but will in effect see a small reduction in their costs. The additional workload is being undertaken without the need to increase our staffing or any other new costs. The fees earned from factoring will therefore be offset against our overheads.

For some time we have seen the potential for us to provide such services. So who knows this could be the start of something big.

Avoiding Frost Damage

At this time of year please remember to take reasonable precautions to protect the water supply pipes inside your home from frost damage.

You are responsible for ensuring that your home is adequately heated to ensure pipes do not freeze. General precautions you should take to cut down the risk of frost damage include:

- Ensure that you know where your main stop-cock is and that you can turn it off and on.
- Make sure that your home is adequately heated.
- Make sure that you do not leave taps dripping.

New Housing At Dunblane and Raploch

Have you ever bought a set of raffle tickets and then discovered you won not one but two star prizes?

That is exactly how our Committee and staff felt in September, when the Scottish Government announced the "winners" of their funding bids for new homes.

We had submitted 2 bids, involving up to 29 homes at Anchorscross Dunblane and 14 flats at Craighall Street in Raploch. Never did we think we'd be given grant for both

but that is what happened.

A total of £1,728,905 in grant funding has been awarded to us and early next year will see us starting to build the homes for rent in Raploch and in Dunblane. The Dunblane homes will be a mix of 15 for rent and 14 for low cost purchase through a scheme known as Shared Equity. Anyone who is interested in finding out more about Shared Equity should contact our office where their name can be added to a mailing list for future details.

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Postal Scam - Royal Mail





The Trading Standards Office are making people aware of the following scam:

A card is posted through your door from a company called PDS (Parcel Delivery Service) suggesting that they were unable to deliver a parcel and that you need to contact them on Tel No: 0906 6611911 (a Premium rate number).

Do NOT call this number, as this is a mail scam originating from Belize.

If you call the number and you start to hear a

recorded message you will already have been billed £315 for the phone call.

Recipe Corner - Babuffca cake

In our last edition we asked if you had a favourite recipe. Agnes Reid, from Fallin has given us one of her favourite cake recipes:

"This is a recipe that came from a young student from the Czech Republic. She was studying English and stayed with us for six months. It's best made up in a ring tin, if you have one."

You will need:

- 1 mug of sugar
- 2 mugs of self-raising flour
- 1 mug of milk
- 2 Eggs
- 1/2 mug of cooking oil
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 dessert spoon of drinking chocolate

Plus: large baking tin or ring tin.

Method:

Mix all of the ingredients together except the drinking chocolate. Put half the mixture into the tin. Gently mix the drinking chocolate into the mixture left in the bowl, then add this to the tin and gently blend to create a marble effect.

Bake in the oven at 180°/gas mark 4 for 40-45 minutes.



Bag It & Bin It!

Following on from last editions article regarding dog fouling we are reminding our tenants who have dogs it is their responsibility to clean up after their pet.

When setting off for a walk remember to pick up a dog waste bag so you can bag it and bin it. As long as the waste is bagged you can use any bin – not just a red waste bin. You can also take it home and put it in your grey bin.

Dog waste is a health hazard, especially for young children. Binning dog waste can help stop the spread of disease to other dogs and avoid owners facing expensive pet bills.

Switching Energy Providers

Using a comparison site is the easiest way to decide which energy supplier will give you the best deal. To use these services you will require:-

- Name of your current supplier
- Name of your current tariff (this will be shown on your bills)
- Your postcode
- The number of units you use per year (this will be shown on your bill)
- Your current payment method

On inputing this information you will be able to check which supplier will give you the best offer. BUT before moving supplier phone your current supplier and check they will not offer you the same or a better deal for you to stay with them. You can also use comparison sites to check the best deal for prepayment meters.

RENT IS A PRIORITY NOT A LUXURY!

Times are difficult for everyone and with the tradition of giving loved ones Christmas presents it can make it harder to make ends meet over the festive period. Paying your rent however is not optional. Please ensure that you pay your rent in full and on time. Failure to pay your rent will result in further action being taken against you.

If you are experiencing genuine difficulties please contact your Housing Officers, Elaine Shepherd and Isabel Reilly.

Alternatively, contact our Income Maximisation Officer, Tracy Doran, immediately for advice and assistance.

We are here to help but you have to take the first step!
Christmas is an expensive time of year but you need to budget to ensure that you can pay your bills and prevent starting 2012 in debt and with a first footing from the Housing Officers.



Electricity Rebates

The Warm Home Discount Scheme provides a rebate on your electricity bills in winter 2011/12 and will run for four years from winter 2011/12.

Who can get the Warm Home Discount?
Pension Credit customers are automatically considered for the rebate.

Those of pensionable age who receive the guaranteed element of pension credit but not savings credit on 11th September 2011, the Warm Home Discount Scheme will credit their electricity account with a rebate of £120 between October and December 2011. This rebate will be undertaken automatically by the electricity supplier. If you think you should have received the rebate and you have not received any correspondence to say you are eligible or you wish to check if you will be receiving the rebate please phone 0845 603 9439.

Can other people get a Warm Home Discount?

Energy suppliers may also give a rebate to some other customers in vulnerable groups (called the broader group). Each electricity supplier has different eligibility criteria they will use to decide who may get the rebate. In some instances if you are on Income Support, Income Related Employment & Support Allowance, or Income Based Job Seekers Allowance you may be eligible. Please contact Tracy Doran at our office to check if you meet the criteria or check our website at www.forthha.org.uk. Alternatively, contact your energy supplier direct to apply.
